To be a joyful, inclusive Christ-centred community, drawing people to know Jesus through our words and actions.

For the next five weekends, (or to put it another way, for the rest of the school holidays) the Gospel reading comes from Chapter 6 of John. It is close to the Jewish Feast of Passover as Jesus feeds a multitude of people, a miracle that recalls God feeding Israel with manna in the wilderness. Jesus then walks on the stormy seas and declares 'I am' though this scene is omitted. Instead next weekend we are introduced to a discourse by Jesus as himself being the bread of life. He teaches what the true bread provided by God is and what it means to feed on this bread. By the fifth weekend we find that such radical teaching has turned some disciples away while others reaffirm their faith in him

John Ch6 is a theologically complex chapter referencing Jewish liturgical traditions and many biblical themes: the tree of life in Eden, the manna in the wilderness, Wisdoms invitation to share in her food. These Old Testament realities help us to understand Jesus and his gift of his body and blood on the cross and in the Eucharist. His self-giving in his passion is made present on the altar as the priest calls on the Holy Spirit to enable the bread and wine presented to become the body and blood of Christ. We witness Christ sacrificing himself to the Father for our sake, in our presence. Or is this too outrageous? Will you and I walk away like some of the disciples at the end of John Chapter 6 or are we affirmed in faith that Christ is present in the Eucharist?

Solemnities and Feasts Ahead

St Martha, **St Mary**, **St Lazarus**: The two sisters and brother who were close friends of Jesus. Jesus brought Lazarus back from the dead and in Martha and Mary we see the interaction of the active and contemplative lives.

St Ignatius of Loyola: Founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in the 16th cent and instigator of the development of spiritual awareness that saw God in all things.

St Alphonsus Liguori: Lived through the 18th cent, a Doctor of the Church, Patron of confessors and moral theologians and founder of the Redemptorists.

Transfiguration of the Lord: The occasion when Jesus takes Peter, James and Jon up on a mountain where Moses and Elijah appear and Jesus' divine glory is revealed in the presence of His Heavenly Father.

St Dominic: Born in Spain in the 12th cent and lived into the 13th cent. Founder of the Order of Friar Preachers (Dominicans) a promoter of the rosary and preacher of orthodoxy at a time of great confusion and division. St Dominic is patron of astronomers and natural scientists.

St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross: An academic of German Jewish background. Studied under and worked with Edmund Husserl. After reading the autobiography of St Teresa of Avila she developed an interest in Christianity which led to her conversion to Catholicism and became a Carmelite nun. She never denied her Jewish roots and despite the persecution by the Nazi's and died in Auschwitz in 1942. She is one of the six patrons of Europe

St Laurence: One of seven deacons who were martyred in Rome in 258. When under pressure from the Roman Emperor to hand over the treasures of the Church St Laurence gathered together the poor and the destitute and told the Emperor here are the treasures of Christ's Church.
