Last Tuesday morning I listened to a senior police officer with 24 years of experience describe the scenes outside the Holiday Inn Express near Manvers as the most frightening encounter he had ever had. He described how the officers outside the hotel fought for the lives of the residents and staff and for each other as they faced a determined group of rioters wanting to burn down the building and all who were inside. It was a chilling account of what had been taking place within the area we live. Last Wednesday thousands of people came out into the streets of many of our towns and cities to say NO to those who had been participating in and promoting the riots. That same evening many people from churches around Rotherham gathered at the Minster for a prayerful vigil of peace. There are times when we have to stand up and challenge those whose message is hate towards someone simply because they are different and they are here. So over the next few days if you have neighbours who are migrants and neighbours who are part of our local police force make a point in asking of their wellbeing and tell them you are praying for them. And if you do know someone who shares the views of the rioters then say to them "No, you do not speak on behalf of our community, the family of God."

Harvesters Catholic Men's group celebrate its' 25th Anniversary this year

In a busy London restaurant a group of five men were in conversation with Charles White-head (well-known leader in Catholic Charismatic Renewal). Charles had recently been to Nova Scotia where the congregation was overflowing with men. Apparently the Bishop had encouraged men to make a deeper commitment to their faith. This had obviously worked.

The decision was made to set up a weekend retreat. The pub they were in was a Harvester pub and so Harvesters became the chosen name for this new work of grace. Since then the weekends have grown and have been held in a number of locations throughout the country, from North to South.

Each weekend consists of a main speaker, small confidential groups where men shared their struggles and they learned to pray for each other, building trust and friendships within the group. There are also workshops to help men grow in their faith and the theme for the weekend is always relevant to men.

This year the speakers will be Rev. Russ Parker and Ronan Johnson and will be held at The Hayes Conference Centre in Swanwick, Derbyshire between September 13 th to the 15 th

Solemnities and Feasts Ahead

St Maximilian Kolbe: He was a Polish priest who volunteered to die in place of a man named Franciszek Gajowniczek in the German death camp of Auschwitz. Maximilian Kolbe was in the camp because of his opposition to the Nazi regime. Franciszek Gajowniczek was later present as a guest at the Beatification of Maximilian in 1971 and his beatification in 1982.

Assumption of the BVM: Having completed the course of her earthly life, Mary Mother of God was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.

- **St Bernard:** He was a 11th cent Abbot, Mystic, cofounder of the Knights Templar, a major leader in the reformation of the Benedictine order through the nascent Cistercian Order. Made a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius VIII in 1830.
- **St Pius X**: St Pius X opposed modernist interpretations of Catholic Doctrine. He promoted liturgical reforms and initiated the preparation of the 1917 Code of Canon Law, the first systematic work of its kind. He was beatified in 1951 and canonised in 1954 by Pius XII

Queenship of the BVM: Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. The title of Queen attributed to Mary is supported by scripture when Gabriel announced at the Annunciation that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever.

St Bartholomew: He was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus, identified as Nathanael in the Gospel of John 1:45-51. Bartholomew is listed as one of the twelve apostles in Matthew, Mark and Luke.
