Solemnities and Feasts Ahead

St Simon and St Jude: These men were chosen by Jesus to become his Apostles and to teach others about God's love and to make disciples of all nations. We inherit their calling today to be missionary disciples of the Lord

All Saints: This is the day we celebrate all the Saints of the Church and in particular those Saints not yet known to us or for whom there is no specific feast day in the year. The Communion of Saints mentioned in the Creed reminds us that the bonds of God's family cannot be broken even by death and that the Saints in heaven pray for us.

All Souls: This is a day of prayer for and remembrance of the faithfully departed family and friends and strangers who have died. Catholics are urged to always pray for the repose of the soul of those who have died.

St Charles Borromeo: He was Arch Bishop of Milan and a leading figure in the Catholic Counter Reformation during the 16th cent which opposed the Protestant Reformation while also reforming the Catholic Church through the Council of Trent.

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica: The Lateran Basilica is the official cathedral of Rome, the mother church of the Catholic world, a sign of unity throughout the Catholic Church.
