Solemnities and Feasts Ahead

St Andrew: Andrew was initially a disciple of John the Baptist before becoming an apostle of Jesus and brother of Simon Peter. After the life of Jesus tradition tells us that St Andrew preached across lands by the Black Sea region .

St Francis Xavier: a native of the Basque region, Catholic missionary and cofounder of the Society of Jesus otherwise known as the Jesuits. His travels took him to Goa, Borneo, the Maluku Islands, and Japan. He was planning to extend his mission work to Ming China when he died on Shangchuan Island.

St Ambrose: A theologian who served Milan as its Bishop from 374 to 397. An influential figure in the Church he inspired many to seek baptism including St Augustine.
