Next Joint Parish Meeting—Our next meeting is at St Gerard's on the 13th January at 6-30pm. This is an opportunity for you to become informed and more involved with the mission of the parishes of the Immaculate Conception and St Gerard's

Second Collections—The first three second collections for 2026 are as follows: Zambia Appeal 17/18 January, Racial Justice 31 January/1 February and Sick and Retired Clergy of the Diocese 7/8 February.

The Zambia Appeal is a charity set up by parishioners at the Blessed Trinity Wick-ersley and headed by Chris McClare. It raises funds to buy building materials which Chris coordinates. Chris is a brick layer by trade, he literally buys the bricks and lays them himself. In this way small communities have been able to have a small hospital and schools.

Joint Evensong at St Leonard's Thrybergh—The parish of St Leonard's Thrybergh have invited the parishioners of St Gerard's to a service of Evensong on Sunday evening 11th January at 5pm. This is the first joint parish prayer service in the area for some years. I invite you to make a note in your diary and attend the service. We hope to host another joint service at St Gerard's in June and both parishes are planning to put on a joint Alpha course between the 15th April and 24th June. The venue will be the recently renovated St Leonard's Church Hall just off Poplar Avenue.

Feasts and Saints

St Stephen (26th December): He is one of the seven men appointed as deacons in Acts Ch6. Later he was falsely charged for using blasphemous words and after he gave his defence he was stoned by the crowd, Acts Ch7, becoming the first martyr of the Christian faith.

St John the Apostle (27th December): John is one of the apostles and associated with the writing of the Gospel according to John. His brother James was another apostle of the Lord.

The Holy Family (28th December): This feast celebrates the life of Jesus with Mary and Joseph, held by the Catholic faith as the perfect model of family life embodying love, faith, humility, and patience. The Feast is celebrated on the Sunday after Christmas Day.

St Thomas Becket (29th December): English cleric and statesman who served as Lord Chancellor from 1155 to 1162, and then as Archbishop of Canterbury from 1162 to 1170. He is known for his conflict with King Henry II over the rights and privileges of the Church and was murdered by followers of the King at Canterbury Cathedral. St Thomas stood firm in defence of truth and right, even at the cost of his life.

Mary Mother of God (1st January): Mary's divine motherhood is an important part of the understanding of the Incarnation and the Second person of the Blessed Trinity. Her life as Mother of God has a unique position in God's redemptive plan.

Basil the Great and St Gregory (2nd January): These two saints were bishops and friends who bravely stood up against the heresy of Arianism which denied the divinity of Christ. They also contributed towards the teaching of the Holy Trinity. Their focus on prayer helped to prepare them for their common mission.
