Next Joint Parish Meeting—Our next meeting is at St Gerard's on the 13th January at 6-30pm. This is an opportunity for you to become informed and more involved with the mission of the parishes of the Immaculate Conception and St Gerard's

Second Collections—The next three collections will take place on Sunday 18th January in support of the Zambia project

promoted by Chris McClare, the 1st February in support of Racial Justice and on the 8th February for the Sick and Retired Clergy of the Diocese.

Community Gathering—The next community gathering will take place on Monday 19th January at the Immaculate Conception 6pm to 7-30pm.

Annual Assessment and Sick and Retired Clergy Levy

The annual assessment that is, the contribution by parishes towards the yearly running costs of the diocese has been set. For the parish of the Immaculate Conception, it is £11,586, and for St Gerard's it is £4,262. Both fees have been paid. The annual levy for the Sick and Retired Clergy fund has been set at £2,834 for the Immaculate Conception and £1,704 for St Gerard's. The appeal will help to raise the profile of the need to support the sick and retired clergy and acknowledge a shared responsibility for the care of priests who have given many years of service to their communities. Please note that there will be a retiring collection for the Sick and Retired Clergy on the weekend of the 7th/8th February.

Feasts and Saints

Epiphany Of The Lord (January 6th): The feast celebrates the 'manifestation' or revelation of Jesus Christ to the world, primarily commemorated in the West by the visit of the Magi (Wise Men) to the infant Jesus.

Baptism of the Lord (11th January): This is another manifestation feast, that is, Jesus being revealed to the world, in this case, by his baptism in the Jordan at the beginning his public ministry. In the Eastern churches this is also known as the Theophany, showing in Jesus' baptism his divine nature with traditions including house blessings and marks the end of the Christmas season.

When do we take down the crib?

This is usually on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord but some traditions leave the crib in place until the celebration of the Presentation of the Lord on the 2nd February. Both cribs in the church will remain in place until the 2nd February.
